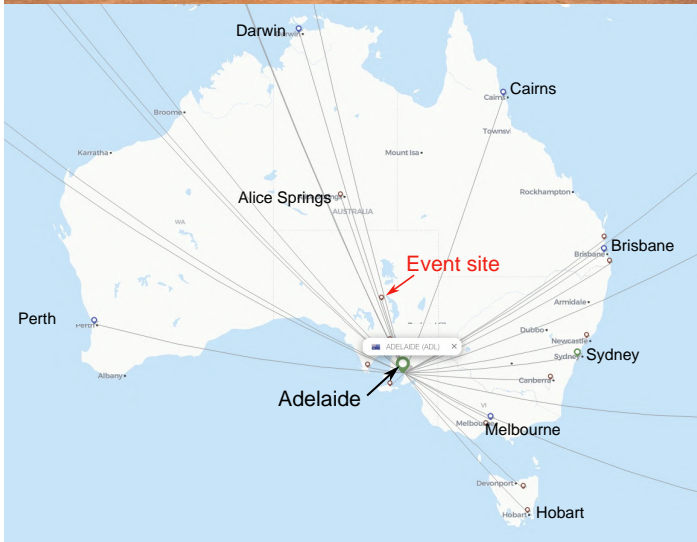
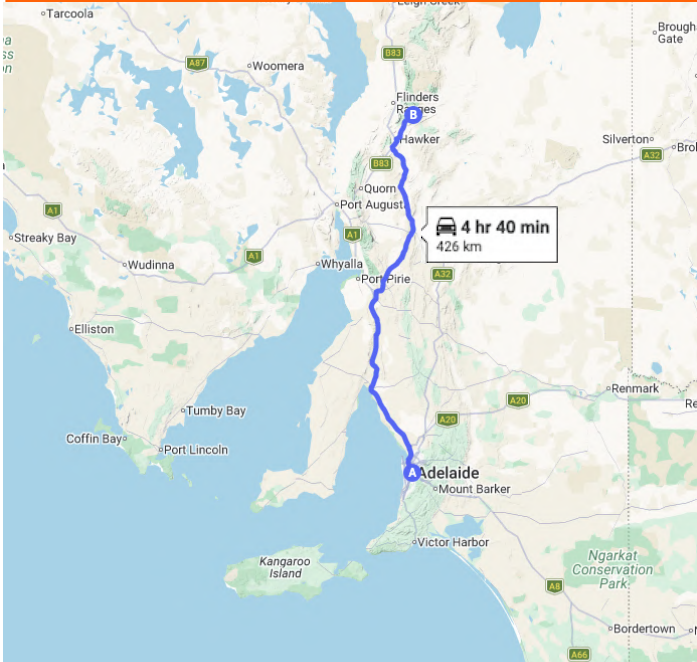

Terrain and Geology

The competition area will comprise spur and gully terrain between 340 m to 870 m above sea level. The course will permit easy to fast walking, or running in the flatter areas. This is dry country. Watercourses only have water after rain. The vegetation is very open, giving excellent visibility. Exposed rocks are hundreds of millions of years old and contain ancient life forms unlike anything today. Course planning strategy, navigation skills, and endurance will be key factors in a successful race, helped by a full moon.

Plants and Animals

Spring in the Australian outback is transformed into a carpet of wildflowers and September is the best month to see them.

On the course expect open country with some acacias, cypress pine and eucalypt forest – including ancient red gums along dry rivers. There is no spikey spinifex that featured in WRC 2016.

During the rogaine you'll see Australia's unique fauna - kangaroos, emus, and possibly wombats and echidnas. There are also many birds such as parrots, cockatoos and wedge-tailed eagles.
